We recently made a change in the management of our homes here in the Village in an effort to improve the lives of both our residents and our staff. Instead of having a Resident Coordinator in each home, we will have four Resident Coordinators who will oversee the management of two homes, and then each home will have a Lead Direct Care Staff. The Lead Direct Care Staff will assist the Resident Coordinators with daily caregiving responsibilities and staff training. This allows the Resident Coordinators more time for the managerial responsibilities, such as processing orders, ordering supplies, keeping in touch with families, and so on. The only exception to this new structure will be our Willow Home, which will remain under the care of the current Resident Coordinator.

Resident Coordinators

In our Village, we now have five Resident Coordinators. Please see below for who they are and which homes they manage.
